When I read the letter to the Thessalonians I am inspired by the fact this letter was only written about twenty years after the Crucifixion. There is a definite assurance that the Christian people owe their identity even in these early days to Jesus and not to Rome. I also feel inspired by the words in verse 3 'Work produced by faith, labour prompted by love and endurance inspired by our hope in the Lord Jesus Christ' Today's readings are in my opinion about knowing God and identifying with him as our God who inspires all we do. In the gospel Jesus replies to those who were trying to trick him by showing him a coin with Caesar's head on it and asking him is it right to pay taxes to Caesar? Jesus gave a very clever answer, 'Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's' Jesus reminds us we have civic duties, we need to pay our taxes, but we must never forget that we give our lives to God and it is God with whom we identify, his will is our priority.

We played a board game 'Logos' with our grandson today which was all about brand names and symbols. It reminded me that we are surrounded by branding, for example wherever you go in the world certain brands such as McDonald's are recognised whatever the language or venue. In our lives we are branded for various things which add up to our identity. It may be the job we do or did, the area in which we live, the team we support... and so the list goes on, it all adds up to who we are.

What is the symbol which shows we belong to God? That we recognise Jesus as our Lord and Saviour and the Holy Spirit as the driving force of our lives? Is it wearing a cross round our necks or on our lapel? Maybe we should do this as a means of making a point and providing a talking point. Maybe another way of showing we serve a living God is by the way we live, the way we love and the kind of people we are who others may recognise as being a little bit different.

Help us, Lord, to be the kind of people you want us to be. Help us to stand out as being different, of having something special in our lives. Help us to never be afraid of speaking of you and of standing up for what we know to be right. We pray for all who are persecuted for their faith, for all who campaign for a better world. In our prayers we remember before God all who are ill at this time, those who are sad and lonely. We pray for all who continue to work with the sick and to see a way of finding a cure to the Virus. Amen.
